COVID Restrictions and Registering Attendance at the Shed

With the possibility of a substantial increase in COVID cases the Shed Committee are keeping a watch on what is happening and are flagging up the possibility of re-introducing restrictions on Shed operations.

Whilst it is unlikely that the earlier booking system will be reintroduced, the strict application of limits to the number of people in the Shed is a likely outcome.

Over the last few weeks some Members have become complacent about putting their names on the white board inside the front door. The whiteboard is provided so that the Shed Manager or Shed Supervisor can see at a glance how full the Shed is and also know who is in the Shed. During COVID restrictions the whiteboard will be used to monitor and manage the number of people in the Shed.

Note that Shed Members attending a session must sign on to the attendance sheet on the lectern near the front door. (a.m. and/or p.m) and records the payment of the Centre's daily \$2 Attendance Fee.

Minimum Number of Members in the Shed

We are required to comply with occupational health and safety requirements defined by the State Government, the City of South Perth, and the Manning Senior Citizens Centre Committee.

The minimum number of Members in the Shed at any time is two of which one must be the Shed Manager or a Shed Supervisor.

Out of Hours Access to the Shed

We are also required to comply with the requirements of the Manning Senior Citizens Centre Committee during out of normal hours.

The maximum number of Members in the Shed during out of normal hours periods is two of which one must be the Shed Manager or a Shed Supervisor.

Shed members can only work on Shed projects during out of normal hours periods. Work on private projects during out of normal hours is not permitted.

Changes to Shed Operations

A number of changes are being introduced to Shed operations and will commence from Monday 13th February 2023:

1. Women's Days.

The Shed has a substantial waiting list of women who wish to attend the Shed training programme and has decided to introduce a second session.

The existing morning session on the 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month will continue and a new morning session will be introduced on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of the month. In both cases the session will be from 8.30am to 1.00pm.

2. Shed Project Only Days

Shed projects play an important part in raising funds for Shed operations and this aspect of our operations needs to have more emphasis. It has therefore been decided that specific sessions during the week will be introduced for work on Shed projects only.

The Monday morning session from 8.30am to 1.00pm and the Wednesday afternoon session from 1.00pm to 4.00pm will be for Shed project work only. All other sessions are as per normal.

Chair Repairs

Like tables, chairs seem to be a never ending item needing repairs and refurbishment. There are a substantial number of chairs stored in the Shed awaiting work to start. A couple of chairs were recently completed and have now left the Shed.

Martin Lawton is always in the thick of the refurbishment activities and he recently completed work on a nice looking Windsor armchair.

Peter Repton took on the job of fixing up an older captain's style chair. These chairs look something like the chairs used on a boat and have a swivel seat mounted on a central raise/lower sprung mechanism. The central mechanism was fitted with four wooden legs. The raise/lower mechanism was broken and Peter did some welding to fix it and then treated and painted it black. Peter also clean up the seat and legs and varnished and polished them to complete the job

Work has commenced on the large woven rattan style chair that was donated to the Shed. The seat is upholstered but the sides and back are all double woven rattan (inside and outside layer). The chair was originally woven by hand and to re-weave the complete chair could be a very time consuming job. We are looking at the use of pre-woven rattan with cane set into a groove which can be done much quicker but requires grooves where the chair currently has weaving holes.

This chair has since been found to be unrepairable so work is proceeding on another chair.

Allan Circles Around

Shed Member Keith Hayes has an older house and a large wooden arch that had seen better days needed to be replaced. Allan Waugh has undertaken the job of constructing a new arch. The arch is in two quarter round pieces.

Allan used a 7.5mm thin strip to form the backing of the arch arch and 6mm strips to build up the other layers. The strips were 55mm in depth and about 2.4m long. The shape of the arch was chalked onto the two benches adjacent to the compactus unit. Pine blocks were screwed at intervals along the line of the arch and just about all the clamps in the shed were used to clamp the strips to the blocks to form the arch.

John and Rob Pull Out The Drawers

John Braithwaite and Rob Craig have been working on the refurbishment of two sets of drawers. A bit of "stripping off (or is it undressing!)" was involved to remove the old finish so that they could be stained black in accordance with the client's wishes.

John undertook the refurbishment of the two chests of drawers taking care to mark the location from which the 6 drawers had been removed.

Rob sanded down the chests and the drawers to remove the old teak like finish and then applied the new darker stain. This involved multiple applications with sanding in between. Rob then used the buffing wheel to shine up and finish the new surface.

Machines and Safety

Automated External Defibrillator

The AED in the Kitchen is now back in service with a new battery and new chest pads. They both typically last for about five years. The chest pads are for use once only and must be replaced after use. If they have never been used they must be changed when a new battery is fitted. The machine will give a short beep every minute or so when the battery needs changing and/or when the chest pads have expired.

Using the Large Laguna Bandsaw

The large Laguna Bandsaw in the Wood Workshop is for making straight cuts only. It requires at least two people to perform a cutting operation, one of whom must be a gold card member who is authorised to operate the bandsaw. Please do not make any adjustments to blade settings - consult the Shed Manager or a Shed Supervisor if the saw needs attention.

Message from Dennis Menzies re Tools for East Timor

Many thanks for the recent donations of hand and gardening tools for the above project. Especially to those who went the extra yard and cleaned and sharpened some of the donations. Prior to this collection, 34 individual tool kits were cleaned, assembled by some members of the Como Rotary Club, and packed in wine cartons for distribution to poor Timorese subsistence farmers.

The kits have been packed in the container which is now full and awaiting despatch to Timor Leste. The Container is located at the Carson Street Special Needs Primary School.

Due to limited storage space at the Container site I have been requested to hold delivery of the tools until March when the next empty Container is due to arrive, but I am still happy to receive donations.

Shoichi Doing the Jig with Feathers

Shoichi Nakanishi has not taken up a new form of Irish dancing but has made some jigs and featherboards to be used on the various saws in the Shed.

For the Large Laguna Bandsaw in the Wood Workshop Shoichi has made a feather board. The feathers were made from grey plastic using the 3D printer and fitted to a plywood plate, made on the CNC Router, which can be clamped to the bandsaw table. He has also made a second feather board for the bandsaw. This one has red plastic feathers and has clamping bolts which fit into the clamping slot on the bandsaw table.

Shoichi has also made a blade alignment jig which is used on the panel saw to align the marked cutting line on the workpiece with the edge of the blade. It is a simple piece of plywood with a strip of plywood attached which fits into the clamping slot on the panel saw moving table. An arrow indicates where the saw blade will cut.

Shoichi has made a longer version of the red featherboard mentioned above. It will fit into the clamping slot on the panel saw.

If the featherboard is rotated by 180 deg the flat edge can be used to provide an additional fence on the saw moving table. Used in conjunction with the Fence on the fixed part of the panel saw table it enables strips to be cut off boards that are too long to cut using the moving table. As the part of the board being cut that is on the fixed part of the panel saw table is not being supported Shoichi's fence keeps the board in place as the cut is being made. A pusher stick must be used on the moving table side of the blade to push the board through.

Use of these featherboards and jigs is included in the training sessions for the saws.
