Registering Attendance at the Shed

Shed Members must still sign on to the attendance sheet on the lectern near the front door. This sheet provides the Senior Citizens Centre Coordinator with a list of Shed Members who have attended a session in the Shed (a.m. and/or p.m) and paid the Centre's Daily Attendance Fee.

Minimum Number of Members in the Shed

We are required to comply with occupational health and safety requirements defined by the State Government, the City of South Perth, and the Manning Senior Citizens Centre Committee.

The minimum number of Members in the Shed at any time is two of which one must be a Workshop Supervisor.

Out of Hours Access to the Shed

We are also required to comply with the requirements of the Manning Senior Citizens Centre Committee during out of normal hours.

The maximum number of Members in the Shed during out of normal hours periods is two of which one must be a Workshop Supervisor.

Shed members can only work on Shed projects during out of normal hours periods. Work on private projects during out of normal hours is not permitted.

Membership Renewals

In June 2023 Shed Members received an email advising that their 2022/2023 Membership subscription had expired and was due for renewal for 2023/2024. This email was generated by the membership management facility in Tidyhq and provided an online link through which Members could pay the renewal amount specified. Note that the amount specified is for Membership of the Manning Men's Shed only.

Due to our connection with the Manning Senior Citizens Centre (MSCC), Shed Members will also have to separately pay to the Centre their membership fee. This additional payment is necessary to ensure that Shed Members are covered by the Centre's insurance (under the present arrangements the Shed does not have its own insurance cover).

Shed Members should show the MSCC receipt to the Shed Manager (or to his designated person) so that it can be copied for Shed records. This arrangement will continue until the Shed has set up its own insurance arrangements. Please note that, following Incorporation, Shed Members can now only renew their Shed Membership online.

Projects

Rocking Horses

John Braithwaite, helped by Ambrose Hargan, has started to put the finishing touches to the antique rocking horse he has been restoring.

Work has been completed on the base and on refitting the horse legs, filling in and sanding the various cracks, and tidying up the joints. The final work to be done is to repaint the black and gold dapple finish on the horse body. John had already completed the gold paint work and some of the black. He and Ambrose set to finishing the remaining black work.

Recently John took a brief "rest" from the dapple horse to make some repairs to a friend's carved rocking horse.

Remember the small white rocking horse. It has had a rather chequered life since it was brought into the Shed some months ago. When it came in it the top half of the head had broken off along a joint line and the tail was almost gone. The broken piece was glued back into place using dowels and a new tail was made using rope strands from a mop head.

Recently new Shed Member Gerry McCarthy took on the job of finally getting the repair work completed. He has filled the crack where the top of the head is joined to the rest of the horse. Mike Harrison has repainted the whole of the horse.

The Jig is Up (and Running)

James Turner and Peter Repton have made up two jigs to speed up the cutting of the plastic pipe

The first jig was made by welding lengths of square tubing to the top of a steel frame which enabled them to hold the plastic pipes in place. Shorter sections of the same tubing were welded to a small frame which was attached to the bottom plate of a circular saw. The spacing of the tubes on the bench is such that the pipe just fits between them. Similarly the circular saw jig just fits over the plastic pipe and runs on the top of the bench tubing. A small plate welded vertically on the end of the bench stops the plastic pipes from rotating when the saw is making the long cut.

After the first long cut the plastic pipe is rotated 180 degrees to make the second long cut. The two lengths of semi circular pipe are then taken to the second jig which is on a steel bench to which a drop saw has been fitted. Stops and a clamp have been fitted to the top of the drop saw table to ensure that each mouse house is cut to the same length.

To make them suitable for display at the clinic Shed Member Ben Gunawardena has been fitting a deeper outer box around the original boxes so that a clear perspex front can be fitted to them.

How Many Shed Members Does it Take to Clamp a Chair?

Clamping is the most challenging part of restoring chairs as it usually requires at least two pairs of hands. In many cases all the joints have to be done at the same time and then they need to be clamped in all directions to ensure they are all fully inserted. However in some cases, especially where curved sections are involved the clamping arrangements can be awkward. The clamps tend to slide along the curve unless they are restrained in some way.

Recently Martin Lawton needed to clamp the joints on a three legged pedestal table. The table top was on a central post which had three curved legs fitted at the bottom with mortise and tenon joints. Martin was assisted by Peter Repton and Mike Harrison. Clamps on each of the three legs were used to stop a strap clamp from sliding up the legs. The strap clamp provided horizontal pressure to keep the tenons on the legs in the mortices on the bottom of the post.

Pots and Plants

Brian Langley has taken a rest from turning wood on the lathe and has made a couple of wooden plant pots or plant holders.

They are made from lengths of treated ceiling joist timber joined to form different sized squares which are fitted together into a three level stack. The sizes are such that when the next square up is rotated by 45 degrees it will fit into notches cut in the middle of the sides of the square below. Long bugle screws were used to make the squares and to secure each level to the level below.

The holders are designed to be placed on the ground and can either be filled with plant pots or with soil into which plants, such as strawberry plants, can be grown.
